



Ken Houston has earned all-star honors for ten consecutive seasons. He is a main ingredient of a defense that set a team record yield of only 189 points in 1977.



One of football's biggest attractions nationwide, the Washington Redskins boast a proud tradition.

Currently riding the crest of seven consecutive winning seasons, matched only by two other clubs, the Redskins are carrying on a winning tradition which began with nine consecutive winning years (1937–45) when the team arrived in the Nation's Capital.

Redskin fans have stayed behind their team for 41 years, always knowing that the organization was dedicated to providing the best. Griffith Stadium, and now RFK Stadium, have rocked with thunderous cheers of the loyal partisans.

Founder George Preston Marshall headed pro football's fifth oldest organization in 1932 in Boston, but transferred the team to Washington in 1937. Marshall helped guide the NFL through rough times and was responsible for the two-division system with a championship game, a slimmed down football for more passing, and a Pro Bowl featuring all-stars. A showman, Marshall had the first team marching band, the first rally song and elaborate halftime shows. The Redskins were the first team to have all their games televised, have a large radio network throughout the South, while all home games have been sold out since the 1960's, with a waiting list for season tickets numbering over 10,000.

Under President Edward Bennett Williams, the Redskins have thrived. Dedicated to excellence, he has supplied the best in players and coaches, while providing one of football's finest training facilities, Redskin Park.

Millions of fans, young and old, are proud to proclaim, "Hail to the Redskins, Hail Victory!"

PRESIDENT

EDWARD BENNETT WILLIAMS is the senior partner in the Washington law firm of Williams & Connolly. A native of Hartford, Connecticut he received his A.B. (summa cum laude) from Holy Cross College in 1941. After serving in the USAAF during World War II, he was graduated from Georgetown University Law School and was admitted to the Bar of the District of Columbia.

Mr. Williams taught Criminal Law and Evidence at Georgetown Law School from 1946 to 1958, was guest professor of American Criminal Law at the University of Frankfurt in West Germany in 1954, and in 1971 was visiting lecturer at Yale Law School where he taught Constitutional Litigation. He holds honorary degrees from eleven universities.

He was Chairman of the American Bar Association Special Committee on Crime Prevention and Control in 1970-72. In 1966 the Bar Association of the District of Columbia presented him with its "Lawyer of the Year" award. He is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, and was a member of its Board of Regents from 1968 through 1972.

By appointment of the Chief Justice of the United States in March of 1965, he served on the United States Judicial Conference Advisory Committee on Federal Rules of Evidence until 1974, and from 1971 to 1974 on the Chief Justice's Committee on Court Facilities and Design. Since 1971 he has served as Chairman of the Judicial Nominating Commission for the Sixth Judicial Circuit of Maryland.

By appointment of President Ford, Mr. Williams served on the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board in 1976 and 1977. In 1977 President Carter appointed him as a consultant to the National Security Agency. He is a past member of the President's Lawyers Committee on Civil Rights.

Mr. Williams served as Treasurer of the Democratic National Committee from 1974 to 1977, has served as general counsel of Georgetown University since 1949, and is a member of the Board of Trustees of the College of the Holy Cross.

He is the author of the best seller, One Man's Freedom, 1962.

He is the father of seven children and is married to the former Agnes Anne Neill, who is also a graduate of Georgetown University Law School. They live in Potomac, Maryland.

With a firm commitment to excellence, Edward Bennett Williams has brought the Redskins to a championship caliber level in the NFL.

Under Williams, only the third president in the team's 45-year history, Washington has thrived, but has not yet reached the pinnacle Williams desires—a Super Bowl victory. The success achieved, however, has earned the Redskins recognition as one of the NFL's strongest teams. Sold-out RFK Stadium and national TV popularity are only small indications of what Edward Bennett Williams has accomplished with the Redskins.

HEAD COACH

JACK PARDEE was named Washington Redskin head coach by Club President Edward Bennett Williams, January 24, 1978.

Pardee's return to the Redskins came just five years and 10 days after he ended a 15-year NFL playing career by announcing his retirement following the Redskins' Super Bowl VII loss to the Miami Dolphins.

"He has the fantastic advantage of really knowing our team, knowing the methods that we have employed, and knowing the personnel," Williams feels.

Pardee, 41, starred at left linebacker and defensive signal caller for the Redskins for two of the team's most successful years, 1971 and '72. During this time Washington won 22 games, posted the team's best record since 1945, and were crowned NFC champs.

Following his retirement, his pro coaching career began immediately as he became linebacker coach for the Redskins.

Debuting as a head coach in the World Football League, in 1974, Pardee accepted the assignment with a franchise that was to be located in Washington, later moved to Norfolk, and finally became the Florida (Orlando) Blazers. As coach and general manager, he guided the team through many financial disasters. Going sometimes without paychecks, the team posted a 14-6 record and entered the WFL championship game, bowing to Birmingham by a single point.

Pardee was the youngest head coach in the NFL (age 38) when he was hired by the Chicago Bears, December 31, 1974. In three years, he took the Bears from a lowly 4-10 record to the NFL playoffs. Only the eighth head coach in Bear history, he earned NFC Coach of the Year honors by UPI and Pro Football Writers Association in his second year. In 1977, the Bears closed with a six-game winning streak, their longest in 18 years (1959). The last time the Bears had been in the playoffs was 14 years ago (1963).

A superb student of the sport, Pardee's football career began at Texas A&M where he starred under Paul (Bear) Bryant. He was selected All-Southwest Conference and had outstanding performances in both the Blue-Gray and North-South post season all-star games. Off the field, he earned classroom honors as a business administration major.

In 1957, the Los Angeles Rams chose Pardee as a second round draft choice and a sparkling NFL career was underway. After his eighth pro

season, an operation to remove cancer in his arm forced him off the field, at which time he entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Texas A&M. Never one to quit, Pardee rejoined the Rams in 1966 after the one-year layoff. When the Rams and the Redskins transacted a seven-player, eight-draft choice trade in 1971, Pardee came to Washington.

In his 15 NFL years, he played in 196 games. His stats read 22 pass interceptions, 13 fumble recoveries, five touchdowns, and a safety and 1963 and 1971 All-Pro honors. As the defensive signal caller, he was a coach on the field.

Redskin fans may well remember Pardee's game vs. St. Louis in 1971 when he intercepted three passes and returned one for a touchdown.

Living with the thought "I've always tried to treat everybody the way I'd like to be treated," he has earned the respect and admiration of those who have come in contact with him.

The 6-2, 225 pounder was voted to the Texas all-time Pro Team in 1975. He coached the South All-Star team in the 1976 Senior Bowl and the Big 10 senior stars against the Pac 8 last year at the Seattle Kingdome in the Challenge Bowl.

Pardee lists his "loves" as church, family and football. He and his wife Phyllis Lane Perryman, were married December 27, 1957, and have five children: Steven, 19 (a sophomore Pre Med student at Texas A&M); Judee, 18 (freshman at Texas Christian University); Anne Marie, 17; Susan, 15; and Ted, 9.

Born April 19, 1936 in Exira, Iowa Pardee spent most of his youth in Texas playing six-man high school ball at Christoval High.

BOBBY BEATHARD

"He has compiled a record that is without equal in the NFL for finding and signing talent . . . ," President Edward Bennett Williams said in announcing the hiring of Beathard as General Manager.

At 41, Beathard already has a success record in achieving talent that no other general manager or talent scout can match.

Over the past four years in Miami, Beathard drafted 23 players in the first six rounds that made the Dolphin roster. In 1977, eight of Miami's 11 picks were on the final 43-man roster. Among players drafted in 1976 and 1977, the Dolphins had eight starters plus a punter in the lineup for the final five games of 1977.

In consecutive drafts, he chose three successful receivers in Nat Moore, Freddie Solomon and Duriel Harris. His "sleepers" include middle line-backer Steve Towle, and running backs Leroy Harris and Gary Davis, each of whom had two 100-yard rushing games in 1977.

With over 15 years of reviewing college talent behind him, Beathard knows the NFL. He began on a part-time basis with Kansas City (1963-66), scouting the western states and then moved on as an aide to Al Davis in the AFL (American Football League) front office. Kansas City made him a permanent scout after three months at the League office, and he stayed until 1968 when he was hired by the Atlanta Falcons. In 1972, Miami named him Director of Player Personnel (as a successor to Joe Thomas).

A native of El Segundo, California, he quarterbacked Cal Poly (San Luis Obispo) to consecutive 9-1 records in 1957-58. He signed with the Redskins in 1959, competing for a spot with Eddie LeBaron, Ralph Guglielmi and Eagle Day. He had a brief stay as a defensive back in 1961 with the San Diego Chargers. His younger brother, Pete, starred at Southern Cal and was a first round draft choice by Kansas City in 1964 at quarterback.

Born January 24, 1937, Beathard is an avid runner. He runs at least 15 miles a day, competing in various marathons as his schedule permits. In 1978, he completed the Boston Marathon in two hours, 55 minutes and the San Diego Marathon in two hours, 57 minutes.

When Beathard isn't traveling the country looking for talent, he resides in Oakton, Va. He has three sons and a daughter, all living in California.

Third year with Redskins. Sixth year in NFL.

Became Redskin: February 10, 1978. Rejoined Redskins after working as a public relations assistant in 1972–73.

Career: Started as sports information director at Califonia State College, Fullerton in 1970. Came to Redskins in 1972, leaving to become PR director for Jack Pardee when he took the job with the Florida Blazers. He became Pardee's special assistant in 1975 when they moved to Chicago.

JOE WALTON, Pittsburgh, '57 Offensive Coordinator

Fifth year with Redskins. Twelfth year in NFL.

Became Redskin Coach: January 16, 1974.

College Playing Career: Played tight end for 3 years at Pittsburgh. All-American, 1956.

Pro Playing Career: He was originally drafted by the Redskins in the second round of the 1957 draft. Played tight end for the Redskins, 1957–60, and for the Giants, 1961–63. He was called "the best third-down receiver in football," by Giant quarterback Y.A. Tittle. His NFL totals read: 178 receptions, 2,623 yards and 28 touchdowns.



Pro Coaching Career: In 1967–68, he served as a special scout for the Giants before joining the coaching staff there in charge of the offensive receivers and overall passing game from 1969–73.

Notable: Joe and his father, Frank, are the only father-son combination to ever play for the Redskins. His father was a guard, 1934–35 and 1943–45. They were the first father-son combination to play in the NFL.

Coaching Career: High school coach at 3 Kentucky high schools, 1957–62, earning State Prep Coach of Year honors for State Champ Danville High. In 1963, he became line coach at University of Kentucky. In 1967 he moved to the University of Cincinnati as line coach and became head coach in 1969 until 1972.



Pro Coaching Career: He coached the Baltimore Colt

linebackers in 1973, but moved on with Jack Pardee to the Florida Blazers of the WFL in 1974 as offensive coordinator. He was the successful line coach at Chicago from 1975-77.

College Coaching Career: Assistant coach at Notre Dame, 1954-55; Southern California, 1957; Pacific, 1958-60, and Oklahoma, 1962-63.

Pro Coaching Career: Oakland Raiders, 1961; Denver Broncos, 1964–65; Atlanta Falcons, 1966; New Orleans Saints, 1967–68; Washington Redskins, 1969–70; Hous-

ton Oilers, 1971; San Diego Chargers, 1972-75; Hamilton Tiger-Cats, 1976.

Military: U.S. Army paratrooper, 1950-53. Also middleweight boxing champion.

College Playing Career: All-SEC quarterback at Tulane. Selected MVP by teammates and was a Player of the Week of Sports Illustrated.

Pro Playing Career: Had outstanding 14-year career with 48 interceptions for 801 yards and 3 TD's. He was selected in round two of the 1959 draft by the Chicago Bears. In 10 years with the Bears he set 5 interception records and was all-pro and leader of the 1963 World Championship team. In 1969, he was traded to Los

Angeles where he helped them to Western Division title. He came to the Redskins in 1971 and played on the Super Bowl team of 1972 with Jack Pardee. He played in 4 Pro Bowls, returning an interception 70 yards for a TD in 1968.

Pro Coaching Career: Was Houston Oilers secondary coach from 1974 through 1977.

JOHN HILTON, Richmond, '65 **Tight Ends. Special Teams**

First year with Redskins. Fourth year coaching in NFL.

Became Redskin Coach: February 9, 1978.

College Playing Career: Led Southern Conference in receiving three years at University of Richmond. He caught 87 passes for 1,289 yards and 14 TD's.

Pro Playing Career: In 9 pro seasons, he grabbed 144 passes for 2,044 yards and 16 TD's. He signed with Pittsburgh in 1965 and later played with Green Bay, 1970; Minnesota, 1971; Detroit, 1972-73. In 1974, he joined the Florida Blazers of the WFL. He was with the Redskins in the pre-season of 1972 before being picked up by Detroit.



Pro Coaching Career: Joined Jack Pardee in Chicago in 1973 as special teams and receivers coach

Bowls: Senior, 1965; Blue-Gray, 1965; Holds Senior Bowl record with 9 receptions.

BOB MITCHELL, Illinois, '58 Executive Assistant to the President

Sixteenth year with Redskins. Twentieth year in professional football. Played 7 years with Redskins, 4 with Cleveland. He joined the player personnel staff after retiring as active player, September, 1969. Was Director of Pro Scouting before promotion February 24. 1978

Became Redskin: December 14, 1961. Historic trade with Browns brought him and halfback LeRoy Jackson to Redskins for no. 1 choice in draft for 1962. Browns got the late Ernie Davis, unanimous all-American of Syracuse University.



Pro Playing Career: Had 72 catches for 1,384 yards and 11 TD's in 1962 to lead the League, Picked no. 8 by Browns in 1958. Immediately took over left halfback and played 48 consecutive games for them. He scored 546 points. He ranked in the top 10 receivers for 10 years. In his 7 years with the Redskins. Mitchell ranked first, second, fifth, fourth, sixth, and fourth. He missed ranking in 1968.

He later served as Purchasing Agent, then Business Manager, before being promoted to Assistant General Manager, Feb. 24, 1978.

Worked for New York bureau of United Press International and then spent 2 years with the NFL office in New York handling waivers, player contracts, trades, and the college draft.



He was the Redskins MVP in 1971 and sportswriters' Most Courageous Athelete, an award he is always considered for every year because of his extreme desire to play and win. Has led Redskins to six consecutive winning seasons, five trips to the playoffs, an NFC championship and a trip to Super Bowl VII.

In his 7 years at Washington, he has won 50 of 68 games. Injuries have slowed him down at times, but never stopped him. He is a courageous athelete who has a long list of games played in (and usually won) when in pain.

In 1976, he passed for 1,252 yards and 12 TD's after coming back from a severely bruised shoulder and ribs to lead the team for four consecutive wins and into playoffs. In 1977, he passed for 1187 yards and returned from injury to lead team to season finale wins against St. Louis and Los Angeles, only to finish in tie and miss playoffs.

His 1,562 career completions is the 20th best total in NFL history. Has passed for 148 TD's and scored 22 himself, one as a receiver. Shows 99 TD's and 72

interceptions since coming to DC

Notable: In his first two seasons, Kilmer caught 27 passes for 288 yards and one touchdown. He also punted 16 times, averaging 37.4 yards.





"He's an eye-catcher. He brings the crowd to its feet," Beathard says of the Redskins' top choice. Green is clocked at 4.5 in the 40 and has unusual balance, according to Beathard. Florida's all-time leading rusher averaged 5.8 and 6.3 yards per carry in his final two years. As a senior he had 726 yards on 119 carries and scored eight touchdowns. Area fans remember his 178-yard game vs. Maryland with a 76-yard touchdown gallop in a 1974 17-10 Florida victory.

Round Eight:

WALKER LEE Wide Receiver—North Carolina 5-11 183

"He's got speed, quickness and the cutting ability you look for in a receiver," Beathard says. Lee went to North Carolina without a scholar ship and earned one because of his skills. A former high school quarter back, he started for a Tar Heel team that was primarily a running oriented school. As a senior he grabbed 16 passes for 220 yards and three touchdowns. He has 4.4 speed in the 40.

DON HOVER Linebacker—Washington State 6-2 222

"Don's a very intelligent player with pretty good speed," Beathard comments. The Redskins also hope to get a lot of special teams action from him. He may have been overlooked because he sat out a year (his junior) to earn money to support his wife and two-year old son by working on a wheat farm.

Round Nine:

JOHN HURLEY Quarterback—Santa Clara 6-3 205

"This guy has the potential to play in the NFL," Beathard feels. He broke his index finger as a senior in the third game, but still passed for 1,103 yards and seven touchdowns with a 63 per cent completion mark. The day he broke his finger, he still completed 19 of 30 for 365 yards and three touchdowns. As a junior, he passed for 1,426 yards and nine touchdowns, including a 28 of 42 for 403 yards and a three-touchdown game. He graduated in January and was working as an accountant. His father played under Amos Alonzo Stagg and was drafted by the Redskins in the 1940's, but chose law school instead.

Round Ten:

Defensive End—Azusa-Pacific 6-3 245

After an outstanding high school career, he was recruited by Nebraska. After two years, he transferred to Azusa Pacific, where he recorded 21 quarterback sacks while earning NAIA All-American honors.

Round Eleven:

MIKE WILLIAMS Cornerback—Texas A&M 5-10 180

"He's had real fine coaching and training. He's also quick and smooth," beathard notes. He's clocked at 4.6 in the 40 and could also help the redskins special teams. From the same alma mater as Coach Pardee and mebacker Brad Dusek.

Round Twelve:

STEVE McCABE

The captain of his college team, McCabe is "a good athlete who has the right attitude." He could earn a back-up spot on the line or special teams with hard work.



First Victory Sept. 16, 1937 The First Game! Thursday night opener draws 19,941 fans to flood-lighted Griffith Stadium. Riley Smith scores on 60-yard run with interception, two field goals and extra point. Redskins 13, Giants 3.

First Title Dec. 5, 1937 First big invasion of New York. Ten thousand feather-wearing fans stomp up Broadway behind brass band. Sam Baugh completes 11 of 15, Cliff Battles runs 75 and 76 yards for TDs, Giants routed, 49-14, for Eastern Championship.

World Champs! Dec. 12, 1937 Freezing weather, frozen field, icy-nerved Bears can't stop Baugh. Completes 17 of 33 for 335 yds and 3 TDs. Wayne Millner, the all-time Notre Dame great, escapes with nine for 160 yds . . . including 77 and 55-yd TD sprints.

Zero Hour Oct. 1, 1939

Only scoreless tie in Redskin history as Giants are battled in mud and rain.

Record Pass Oct. 15, 1939

From kick formation, standing deep in end zone, Frank Filchock flips pass to Andy Farkas who goes all the way for touchdown. Longest pass play in National League history . . . 99 yards.

Eastern Champs Dec. 1, 1940 Miniature-sized Davy O'Brien of Eagles completes 33 passes in 60 attempts, but Redskins win 13 - 6 to clinch Eastern Championship.

73-to-Ohhh! Dec. 8, 1940 Redskins get more first downs than Bears in World Championship Game at Griffith Stadium.

Nov. 23, 1941

Fifty seconds to go in this Eastern Championship Game, Redskins hold 13 - 10 lead. But Giants get field goal and touchdown to win, 20 - 13.

Only Loss Sept. 27, 1942 Giants don't make first down, gain only ONE yard rushing, complete just ONE pass . . . but it's good for TD; then they capture another TD on interception . . . and we suffer our only 1942 defeat, 14 - 7.

World Champs! Dec. 13, 1942 Bears take early lead on errant pass from center. But Sam Baugh's 85-yd quick kick sets them back on their heels. Wilbur Moore then makes vital interception and follows with sensational catch for 38-yd TD. Andy Farkas caps victory by carrying ball 10 of 12 times on 80-yd TD tour. Score: 14 - 6.

Champs Again! Dec. 19, 1943 After two straight losses, Redskins bounce back in Eastern Title playoff game to thrash Giants 28 - 0.

Untitled Dec. 26, 1943 Sam Baugh suffers concussion early tackling Sid Luckman on punt return and Bears go on to win, 41 - 21.

Eastern Champs Dec. 9, 1945 Second straight shutout (Steelers 0 - 24 Dec 2) vs Giants today, 17 - 0, wins Eastern title.

Post Mortems Dec. 16, 1945 In subzero weather, Redskins lose world title to Rams, 15 - 14, on incredibly freakish plays. Baugh's pass from end zone hits goal-post for safety (no longer allowed); and Waterfield's try-for-point hits crossbar and bounces over.

Champs Trumped Nov. 23, 1947

Fans give auto to Sam Baugh who thanks them with 6 TD tosses, routing champion Cards, 45 - 21.

Twenty-one points in 137 seconds! Eagles lead 16 - 0 **TD Torrent** in 3rd quarter. Brito recovers fumble on their 32 Oct. 1, 1955 and LeBaron passes to Janowicz for TD. Thomas recovers kick-off in end zone for TD. Torgeson recovers fumble on Eagles 13. Janowicz goes over. Redskins win, 31 - 30.

World Champion Colts nipped in final 11 seconds by Colts Corraled Nov. 8, 1959 Sam Baker's 46-yd field goal.

Dick James scores 4 TDs to set Redskins single game 4 of a Kind scoring record in 34 - 24 win over Dallas. Dec. 17, 1961

Redskins stun public by trading OB Norman Snead Spring Time to Eagles for veteran OB Sonny Jurgensen. Then 1964 repeat the performance, shipping favorite Dick James to N.Y. for Sam Huff.

Sonny Jurgensen out-duels Norm Snead by pitching A Sunny Day four TD's against the Eagles in the first meeting of Oct. 11, 1964 the TRADED quarterbacks.

Sonny Jurgensen sparks greatest comeback win in Indians Scalp 'em Redskin history. Down 21-0, Redskins record 34-31 Nov. 28, 1965 victory over the Cowboys as Sonny passes for over 400 yds and 3 TDs.

The Redskins score the most points in NFL history TD Jamboree as they tie or set many team and league records in Nov. 27, 1966 routing New York, 72-41.

Sonny Jurgensen sets new Redskin and NFL passing Pass-Catch records for most attempts, completions, and yards. Records, 1967 Receivers Charley Taylor, Jerry Smith and Bobby Mitchell finish 1, 2, and 4 in the league; highest ever by receivers on same team.

Redskins defeat New Orleans by score of 17-14 to A Winning Season insure their first winning season since 1955. Victory Dec. 14, 1969 also kept Coach Lombardi's record of never having coached a losing NFL team intact.

Larry Brown, on second offensive play of game with A New Hero Eagles and needing 4 yards to break the 1000 yard Dec. 13, 1970 barrier, takes handoff from Sonny Jurgensen and gains 12 yards to become the first Redskin in history to become a member of the 1000 yard club.

> Larry Brown, gaining 44 yards against the Cardinals. ends the season as the top rusher in the NFL with a total of 1125 yards in 237 attempts for a 4.7 avg. He is the first Redskin to win an NFL rushing title.

Allen guided Redskins to most wins, 9, in 29 years Future Is Now with 9-4-1 record. First time in 26 years Redskins 1971 gained championship playoff game.

Coach of Year George Allen voted NFL and NFC "Coach of Year." 1971 NFC Champions! Redskins won first title in 30 years with a convincing Super Bowl 26-3 NFC championship win over defending world 1972 champion Dallas Cowboys in RFK Stadium following big 16-3 NFC playoff victory over Green Bay, also in RFK Stadium. Played the Miami Dolphins in Super Bowl VII in Los Angeles' Coliseum. Lost Brown - NFL Larry Brown honored by all selections as "NFL "Player of Year" Player of Year." Won NFC rushing title as he set new Redskin rushing record with his 1,216 yards, his 1972 second over 1,000 vard year. NFC Coach of For second year in row, George Allen accorded Year, 1972 "Coach of Year" honors. NFC East Redskins had the best record (10-4) in the NFC East. Co-Champs, 1973 Second best in NFL. 4th Straight Year For the fourth consecutive year, all under Allen, the In Playoffs, 1974 Redskins made the NFL playoffs. All-time receiver Redskins wide receiver Charley Taylor became the 1975 all-time reception leader in NFL history with his 634th career catch against the Eagles in the season's finale. By winning final four games, including wins at Dallas 1976 and at St. Louis, Redskins made playoffs for fifth time in six years under Allen.

Return to Playoffs

7th Consecutive Redskins finished 9-5 for 7th consecutive winning Winner, 1977 season, but missed playoffs even though they tied with Minnesota and Chicago.

SCORING STREAK.... Washington will carry an 88 consecutive game scoring streak into the 1978 season. The last time the Redskins were shutout was Nov. 21, 1971. During that time, the defense has posted seven shutouts. The Redskin team record for consecutive games scoring is 129 games, attained from 1961-70.

PRO BOWLERS A total of 30 Redskins have been selected by fellow players to appear in the NFL Pro Bowl since the merger of the two leagues in 1970. In those eight years, 14 offensive players, 11 defensive players and five special team players were selected. Ken Houston has been an NFC cocaptain the past two years.



The Super Bowl

The winner of the two conferences meet in the NFL title game - The Super Bowl. An additional wild card team from each conference will be added in 1978.

Redskin Playoff Record

1971 Redskins—NFC Wild Card Winner (9-4-1) Dec. 26, 1971—Redskins 20, San Francisco 24-Away

Redskins take a 10-3 halftime lead but fail to cash in on scoring opportunities. A Brodie to Washington 78-yard scoring pass ignites a winning 49er counter-attack.

1972 Redskins—Eastern Division Champions, NFC (11-3-0) Playoff Game—Dec. 24, 1972—Redskins 16, Green Bay 3-Home

Powerful Redskin defense cuts off Green Bay running attack and the Redskins win their first playoff game under the new NFL championship rules. Billy Kilmer hit Roy Jefferson for a score and Curt Knight kicked three field goals.

NFC Championship—Dec. 31, 1972—Redskins 26, Dallas 3-Home

The Redskins win their first conference championship in 30 years with a smashing victory over the defending conference and Super Bowl champion Cowboys. Kilmer flipped two touchdowns to Charley Taylor and Knight booted a playoff record 4 field goals. Defense was outstanding all day.

Super Bowl VII-Jan. 14, 1973-Redskins 7, Miami 14-L.A.

Undefeated Miami cooled off the Redskins attack and the Dolphins became Super Bowl champions with the first undefeated season by any NFL team since the 1941 Chicago Bears.

1973 Redskins—Eastern Division Co-Champions, NFC (10-4) Dec. 22, 1973—Redskins 20, Minnesota 27-Away

Both Dallas and the Redskins finished the regular season with identical 10–4 records, but because of the point differential in head-to-head play, the Redskins were assigned the NFC "wild card" berth. The Redskins were led by quarterback Billy Kilmer, who had spent all of that week in a Washington, D.C. hospital with a stomach ailment that required surgery after season. Vikings rallied from 7-3 halftime deficit and 10-10 4th quarter tie.

1974 Redskins—Eastern Division Co-Champions, NFC (10-4) Dec. 22, 1974—Redskins 10, Los Angeles 19-Away

Although both the Redskins and Cardinals finished with identical records of 10-4 in the NFC's Eastern Division, the Redskins were again awarded the "wild card" berth since they lost to the Cardinals twice during regular season play. Despite holding a 10-7 lead at halftime, the Redskins were unable to score in the second half and faltered 19-10.

1976 Redskins—NFC Wild Card Winner (10-4) Dec. 18, 1976—Redskins 20, Minnesota 35-Away

The Burgundy and Gold returned to the playoffs for the fifth time in the last six years facing Minnesota, who sported the best record in the NFC. The Redskins fell behind in the opening eighty-one seconds on a Viking TD and were unable to make up a 21-3 halftime deficit, despite scoring 17 points in the second half.


